I understand that my child will be involved with a rustic residential camping experience that includes:

- a) Living in rustic cabins
- b) Hikes and exploring plants, insects, and animals in wooded areas
- c) Wading, swimming, and boating in Lake Jacksonville
- d) Participation in recreational and sporting events such as volleyball, soccer, archery, etc.
- e) Inherent risks, such as sunburn, insect bites, and poison ivy.

Western Illinois Youth Camping Program works to provide a safe, educational, enjoyable camping experience:

- a) Youth are supervised at all times by screened, trained staff
- b) Camp registration includes supplemental accident insurance – liability cap is \$3,000 if injury should occur
- c) First aid staff are on duty 24 hours a day
- d) Facilities are approved by county and state health departments
- e) Menus are approved by a registered dietician.

All campers and staff are expected to:

- a) Be honest and trustworthy in all words and actions
- b) Show respect for self, for others, and for property
- c) Accept responsibility for your share of the chores and for your actions as a camper
- d) Treat others fairly
- e) Be kind and caring to others and treat others as you would like to be treated
- f) Do your part as a citizen of camp—keep cabins and grounds clean for everyone to enjoy, beds should be made, dry clothes picked up and wet clothes hung on a line outside the cabin(s).

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Additional rules of camp include:

- a) NO tobacco products, NO alcohol or other drugs, NO firecrackers, NO guns, NO knives are allowed. Presence of any such items will result in the notification of parent or guardian to arrange immediate removal of camper from campgrounds.
- b) Selling, renting, leasing, buying, or otherwise borrowing clothes or other items for something of value between campers and counselors is prohibited at camp. Failure to abide by this rule will result in arrangement of immediate removal from campgrounds of camper and counselor.
- c) Campers are to remain on campgrounds AT ALL TIMES unless permission has been pre-arranged with the camp director. Leaving campgrounds without permission may result in immediate dismissal from campgrounds to parent or guardian.
- d) Everyone should wear protective footwear – no sandals or thongs, except while showering or swimming
- e) Swimming and boating is to take place at scheduled times when lifeguards are on duty!! NO ONE enters the water unless the lifeguards are on duty and say that it is O.K. to enter the water.
- f) Campers should stay out of restricted areas – for example, staff living quarters, other cabin areas, buildings that are locked, and the dining hall/kitchen, except at mealtimes.
- g) At the end of the evening program each night, quiet times will be enforced to allow all campers, counselors, and staff members a good night's sleep to relax and prepare for the next day.

Written Notice of Passive consent:

As a participant in 4-H Camp, your son or daughter may be asked to complete a written survey about what he or she may have learned from participating in the program. We estimate that it will take the youth participants approximately 10 minutes to complete the survey.

Youth are not required to participate in the evaluation. The survey responses will be anonymous, and your son or daughter's responses will not be identified in any way. If you do not want your son or daughter to participate in the evaluation of 4-H Camp, please contact your local Extension office before your child begins attending the program.
